

DISNEY MERCHANDISE BAG RECYCLING

Reusing your recycled-content plastic Disney bag over and over again around the house or office is the smartest thing to do. Once you're ready to recycle it, consider these resources to find the closest recycling collection point to your home or office:

- Recycle your Disney low-density polyethylene #4 bags (and any other #2 and #4 plastic bags you may have) by finding a dropoff site at http://www.plasticfilmrecycling.org.
- 2. Visit http://www.earth911.org and use the search box in the upper left to find a recycler in your area.
- 3. Large retailers such as Wal-Mart and many national grocery stores like Kroger, Giant Food, Stop and Shop, Safeway and Whole Foods may provide bag collection barrels for customers.

TIPS

- Keep plastic bags clean, dry and free of food to ensure successful recycling.
- Remove paper receipts from bags prior to recycling.
- Do not include cling wrap or pre-packaged food bags, like pre-washed salad or frozen food bags.
- Do not include biodegradable, compostable or cloth reusable bags.
- Do not include loose bags in curbside recycling or trash bins to prevent them from blowing away or becoming contaminated.
- Do not bring plastic bags to the beach or shore where wind is likely and may cause empties to blow away. Use reusable cloth bags instead.
- Volunteer for local cleanup events—you'll likely see lots of littered plastic bags, which
 may motivate you to use them less and recycle them more.
